Dear Mayor Daley:

This report presents statistical data on Chicago Police activities for 1965 and comparative data for 1964. It is submitted as a supplement to our Annual Report which will be issued soon. The Statistical Report is specifically designed for reference use by law enforcement agencies at city, state and national levels--and by others who regularly request such information from this Department.

The major accomplishment of Chicago Police in 1964 and 1965 was its continuing reduction of serious crimes. In 1965, serious crimes dropped 11.9% following a prior decrease of 3.1% in 1964. This accomplishment assumes even greater importance in the light of nationwide increases in major crimes as reported by the FBI. In 1965, nationwide averages for serious crimes rose approximately 5%, preceded by an increase of 13% in 1964.

In 1965, as in 1964, the National Safety Council named Chicago as the safest among the nation's five largest cities. For 1965, the fatality rate was only 2.9 per 10,000 registered vehicles; for 1964, 2.7.

Throughout 1965, continued improvements enabled the Department to cover the city with a greater blanket of aggressive preventive patrol than at any previous time. Because of this stepped-up patrol, beat officers were deployed by the Department's Communications Center within seconds after an emergency call was received.

A significant highlight of both 1965 and 1964 was Chicago's emergence from the summer periods without serious racial incidents.

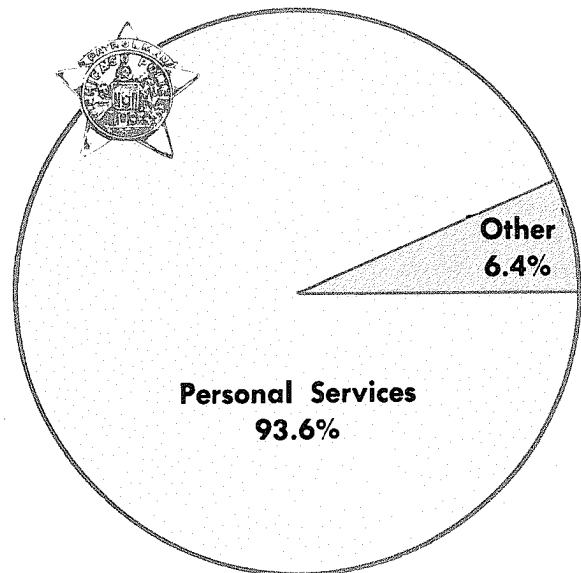

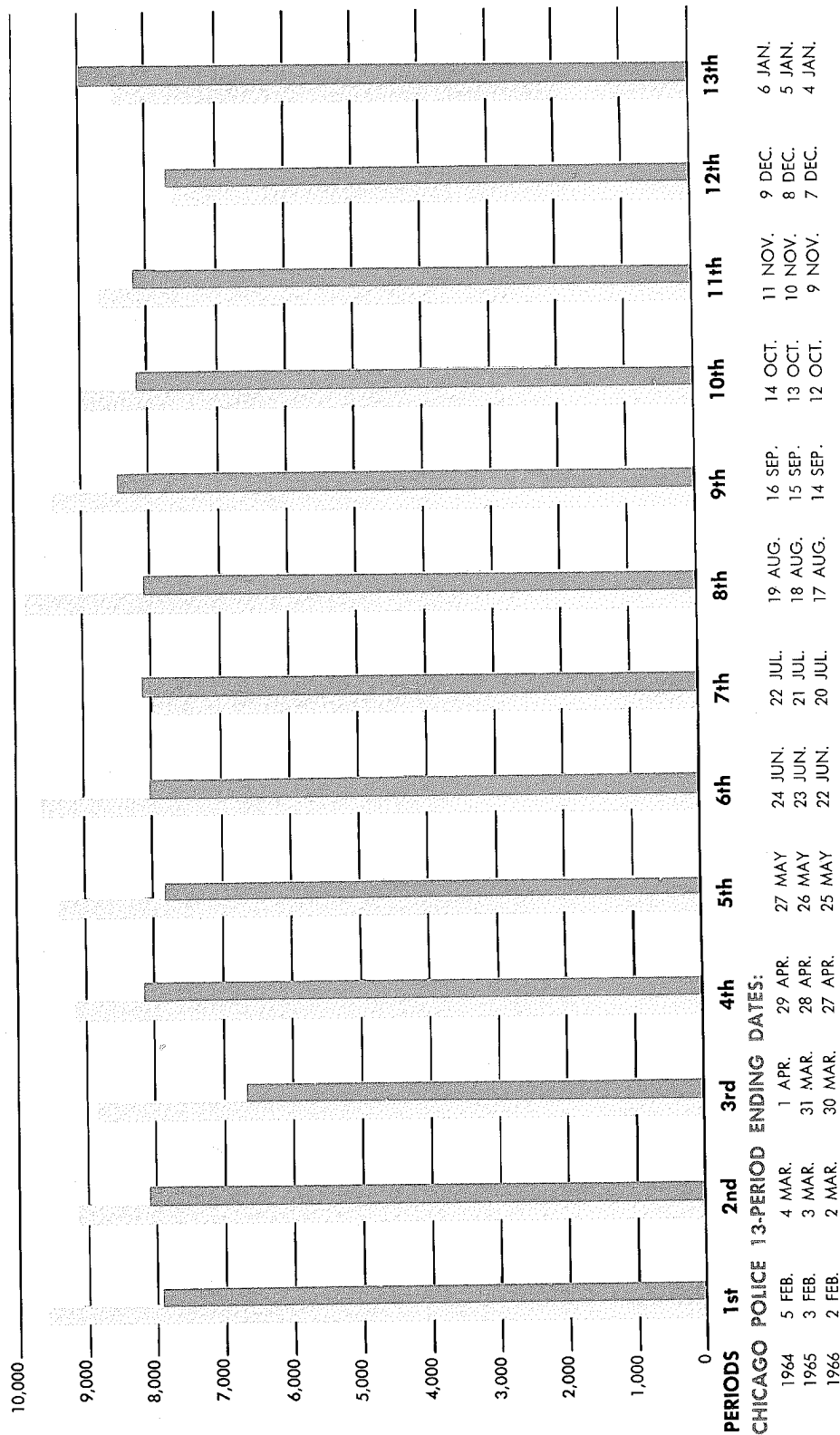

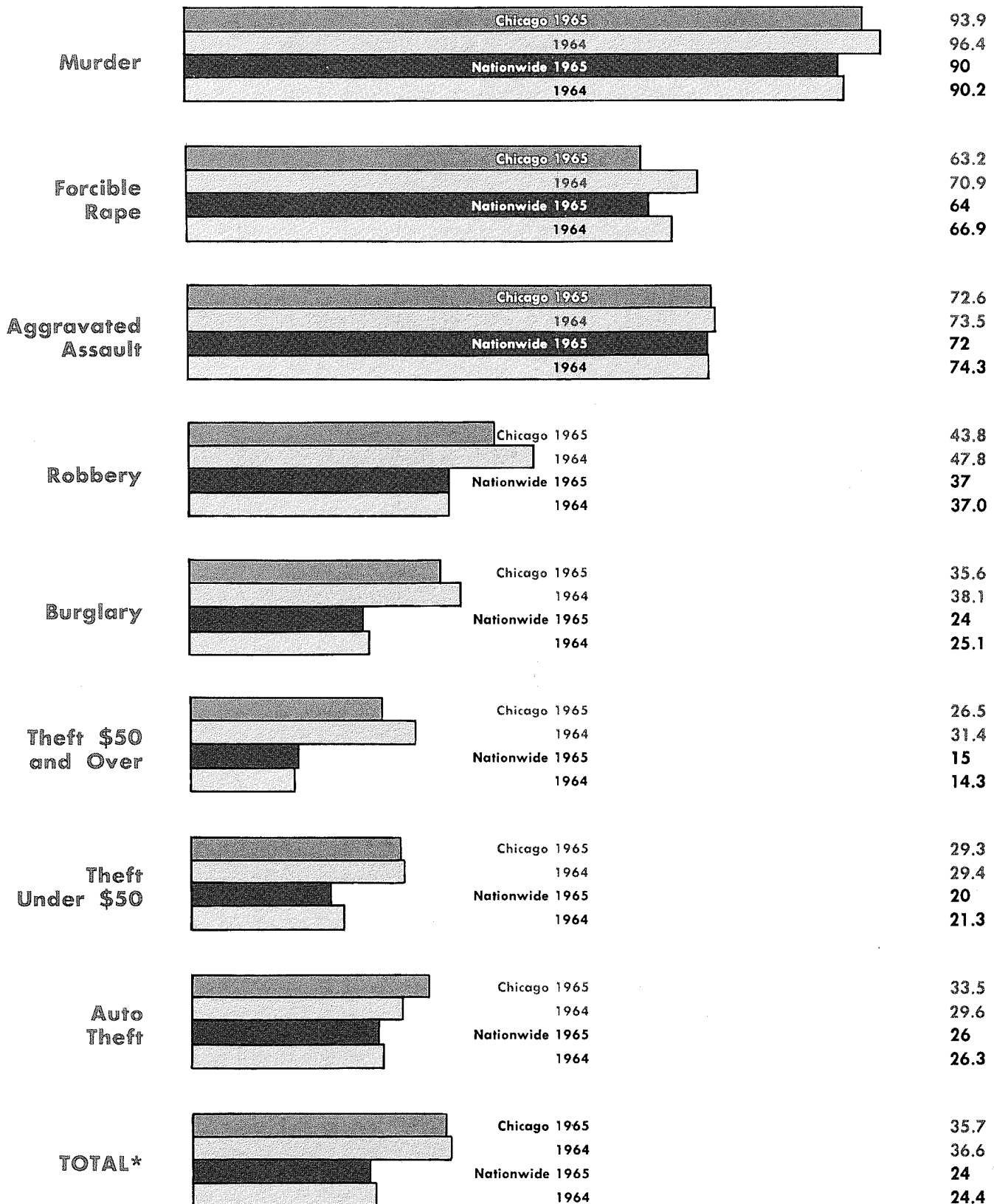

## *Chicago and Nationwide Percentages\**

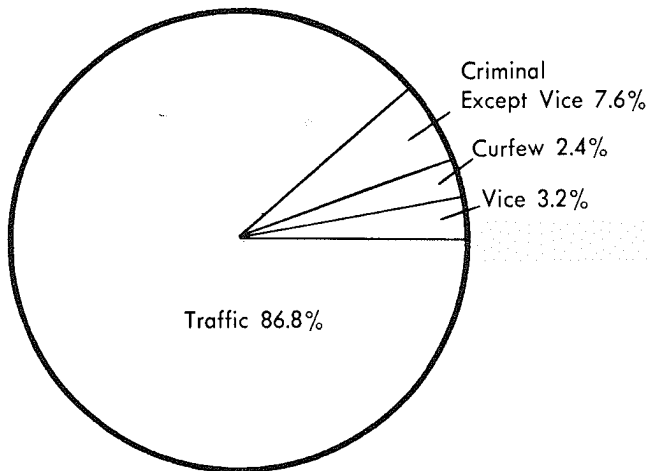

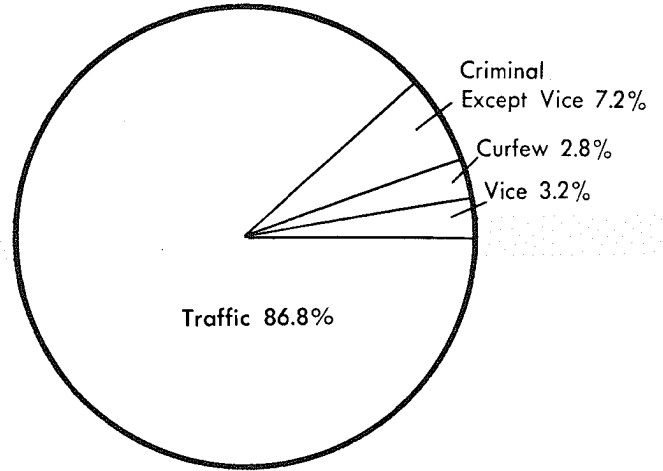


# ARRESTS—TYPES and DISTRIBUTION

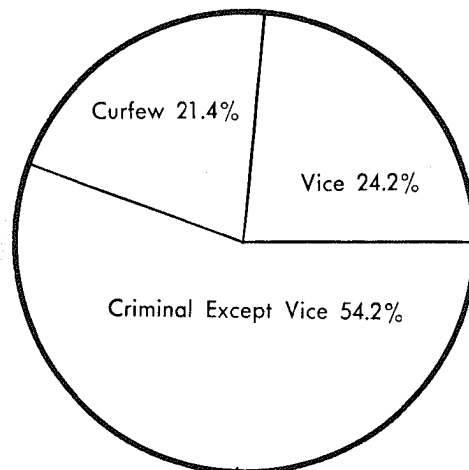
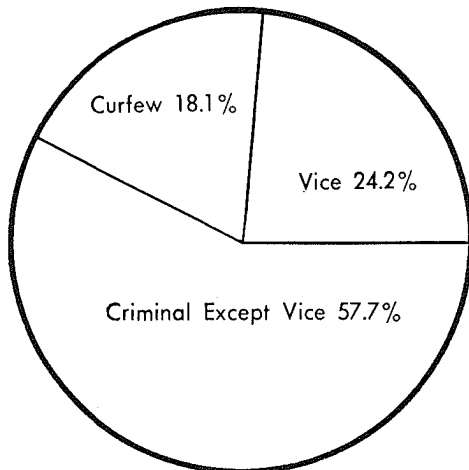

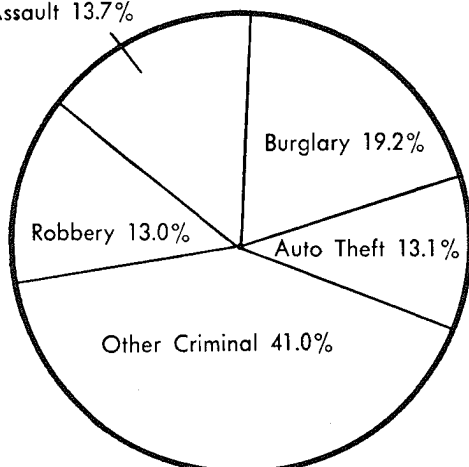


DISTRIBUTION — ALL ARRESTS BY TYPE

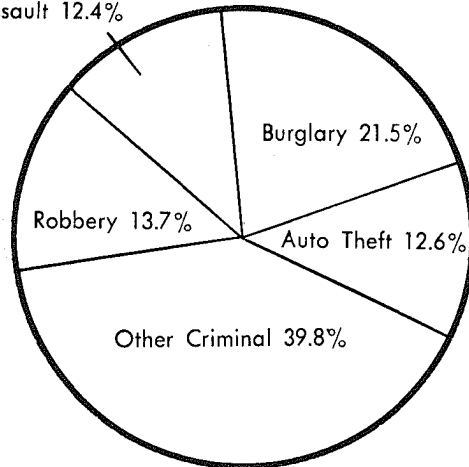


DISTRIBUTION — ALL ARRESTS EXCEPT TRAFFIC

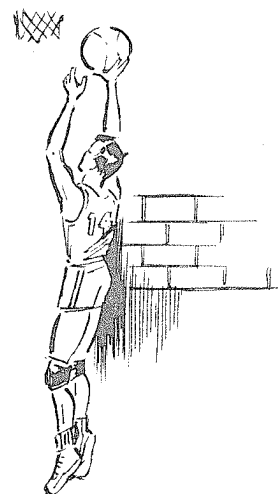

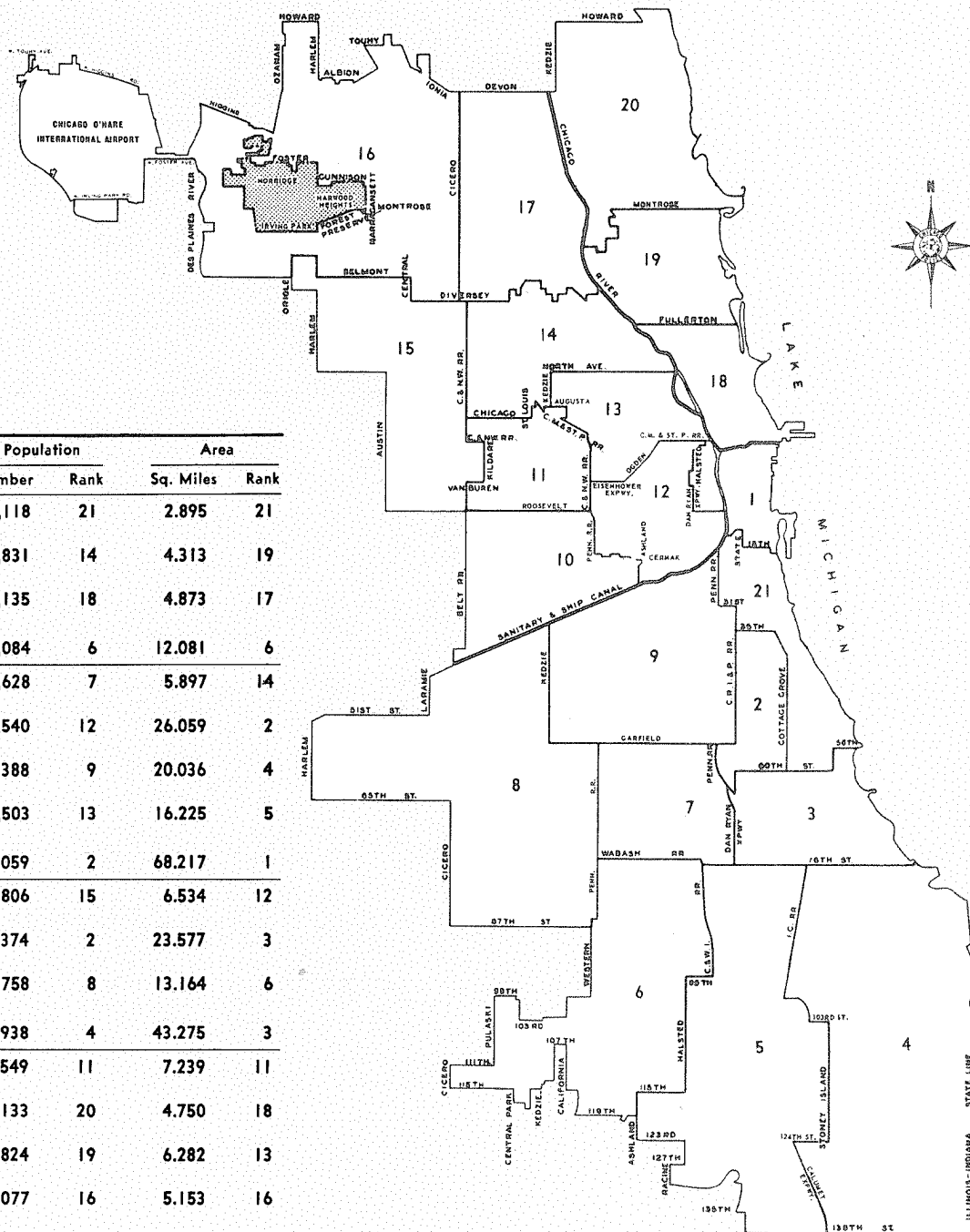
