Problem Statement	1. <i>Who is / are the victim(s) in this criminal activity?</i> COMMUNITY MEMBERS THAT RESIDE ON BEAT 2431	
	2. <i>Describe the methods / actions used by the offender (do not include demographic information).</i> THE OFFENDER(S) GENERALLY TRESPASS UPON THE FRONT PORCH OF A RESIDENCE OR ILLEGALLY ENTER THE VESTIBULE OF A MULTI-UNIT BUILDING AND REMOVE THE PACKAGE(S) THAT HAD BEEN RECENTLY DELIVERED. OFFENDERS GENERALLY OBSERVE DELIVERIES BEING MADE BY THE USPS, AMAZON, UPS AND FEDEX AND REMOVE AS MANY PACKAGES AS THEY CAN CARRY AWAY. DUE TO THE FREQUENCY OF PACKAGE DELIVERIES THESE TYPE OF THEFTS HAVE BECOME A TREMENDOUS CRIME OF OPPORTUNITY FOR THIEVES.

	2. <i>Describe the methods / actions used by the offender (do not include demographic information).</i> OFFENDERS HAVE MULTIPLE METHODS OF PERPETRATING THESE CRIMES. GENERALLY, FOR BASIC THEFTS FROM MOTOR VEHICLES, OFFENDER(S) WALK AROUND AN AREA AND CHECK CAR DOOR HANDLES TO ASCERTAIN IF THE VEHICLE IS OPEN OR LOCKED. ONCE DISCOVERED UNLOCKED, OFFENDER(S) OPEN THE DOOR AND RAPIDLY SEARCH THROUGH THE INTERIOR LOKKING FOR VALUABLES TO STEAL. IN INSTANCES WHEN THE THEFTS ARE TARGETING VEHICLE ACCESSORIES (WHEELS, CATALYTIC CONVERTORS), THE OFFENDER(S) IDENTIFY AREAS THAT ARE QUIET AND POORLY LIT. THE CRIMINALS THEN WORK AS A TEAM TO DROP OFF AN OFFENDER TO COMMIT THE CRIME, THEN RETURN IN THEIR AUTO TO PICK UP THEIR ACCOMPLICE AND THE PROCEEDS IN THE OFFENDING VEHICLE.

	2. <i>Describe the methods / actions used by the offender (do not include demographic information).</i> OFFENDERS COMMIT ROBBERY BY DIFFERENT MEANS (ARMED: HANDGUN, ARMED; OTHER DANGEROUS WEAPON, STRONG ARM: NO WEAPON, AGGRAVATED, AND ATTEMPT). THE MOST REPORTED MEANS OF ROBBERY ARE STRONG ARM IN WHICH OFFENDERS APPROACH A VICTIM ON FOOT, THREATEN THE VICTIM WITH BODILY HARM AND/OR STRIKE THE VICTIM, AND DEMAND CELLULAR PHONES AND MONEY. ONCE THE OFFENDER IS IN POSSESSION OF THE VICTIM'S PROPERTY, THE OFFENDER QUICKLY DEPARTS THE SCENE ON FOOT.
